Purpose: The rule changes will clarify that the board shall dismiss based upon a stipulated motion. The rule changes clarify terminology to reduce confusion about the board's statutory authority. They require exhibits to be formatted and filed in accordance with certain standards. They require the board to determine whether the respondent has delayed or suspended the effective date of the action subject to petition. They allow the board to refer a matter of continued noncompliance to the department of commerce to provide technical assistance.
